Basic Functions:

The Student Life Assistants – Pre-University Programs will be directly responsible for ensuring the smooth delivery of all residential & campus life activities and off-campus excursions of UBC Extended Learning's pre-university programs. The position reports directly to the Senior Student Life Assistants, Pre-University Programs, UBC Extended Learning. The duration of pre-university programs is from July 6 – August 16, 2025, and the training for the role runs from July 2 – July 5, 2025. All interested candidates must be available for the entire duration of the position. Student Life Assistants will move into the on-campus residence on July 2, 2025.

Specific Duties & Responsibilities:

- Ensure the health and safety of students:
- Supervise all activities, meals, and free time in residence;
- Accompany students in afternoon, evening, and weekend on and off-campus activities;
- Attend to students' concerns;
- Participate in daily team meetings with other Student Life Assistants and Senior Student Life Assistants;
- Be on campus 24 hours a day during the program schedule / on-duty days;
- Participate in activities as a role model of appropriate enthusiasm and social skills;
- Ensure that students are abiding by residence rules and regulations;
- Ensure that bedtime and wake-up are on time;
- Perform intermittent early morning and late evening duties;
- Perform late-night rounds with other Student Life Assistants.

Qualifications:

- Experience working with students ages 15-18 in group settings;
- Experience working with culturally diverse youth;
- Familiarity and knowledge about both UBC and Vancouver;
- Strong customer service & communication skills;
- Hard-working, ability to work independently and as part of a team;
- Ability to adapt to new situations and to be flexible with change;
- Satisfactory completion of a criminal records check with enhanced police information check (and/or vulnerable sector check);
- Current Standard First Aid and CPR-C/AED certification;
- Ability to speak a language in addition to English is an asset;
- Experience in live-in and/or international programs (preferred);
- Ability to use a personal cell phone with data for work purposes (required).
