## Pre-University Summer Program for High School Students

At UBC Future Global Leaders, high school students ages 15-18 can experience life at a top-tier university. Students explore their passions and interests, make friends from around the world, and develop the skills they need for their futures.

### Program Highlights

- UBC Future Global Leaders is an official UBC program.

- UBC Future Global Leaders two-week courses can be combined to make a four- to six-week program.
- Students can stay in a UBC student residence on campus and live the full university experience or commute daily.

The residence option provides even more opportunities for English Language students to interact with English-speaking students from Canada and other countries, offering international students an authentic Canadian university experience.

## Admissions and Registration

Registration opens **January 8, 2019**. Students must be 15 to 18 years old on or before the course start date.

For **Academic courses** it's recommended students have a minimum:

- **GPA (Grade Point Average) score** of 78% or equivalent. Students are required to support this with the most recent school report card or transcripts.
- **IELTS (International English Language Testing System)** score of 6.0 or equivalent, **TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language)** Internet-based test score of 80, or equivalent.

For **English Language courses**, students are recommended to have a minimum:

- **GPA (Grade Point Average) score** of 78% or equivalent. Students are required to support this with the most recent school report card or transcripts.

- **IELTS (International English Language Testing System)** score of 5.0 or equivalent, **TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language)** Internet-based test score of 60, or equivalent.

**Note about language requirements:** English language requirements are recommended to ensure that students can participate and benefit fully from the curriculum. Students self-assess and are not required to provide proof of English language proficiency. If, however, a student is unable to participate effectively in English, the student will be placed in an English Language course.

All fees are in Canadian dollars (CAD) and are subject to change.

Residence Option	<b>CAD \$3,045</b> for <b>one</b> two-week course, including airport pick-up and drop-off services, accommodation in a UBC campus residence (single occupancy), three (3) meals per day on campus, workshops and all group-led activities. <i>Local medical insurance is provided for Canadian students travelling from overseas.</i>
Commuter Option	<b>CAD \$1,600</b> for <b>one</b> two-week course, including afternoon workshops and group-led social activities from 1pm to 5pm, Monday through Friday. Lunch is also provided Monday to Friday, as well as dinner on Fridays. Special events on Friday evenings are also included. <i>Local medical insurance is provided for Canadian students travelling from overseas.</i>

International Students	
Residence Option	<b>CAD \$4,095</b> for <b>one</b> two-week course, including airport pick-up and drop-off services, accommodation in a UBC campus residence (single occupancy), three (3) meals per day on campus, workshops and all group-led activities. <i>Local medical insurance is provided for international students.</i>
Commuter Option	<b>CAD \$2,650</b> for <b>one</b> two-week course, including afternoon workshops and all group-led activities from 1pm to 5pm, Monday through Friday. Lunch is also provided Monday to Friday, as well as dinner on Friday. Special events on Friday evenings are also included. <i>Local medical insurance is provided for international students.</i>
